The Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth, founded in 1858, have provided more than 140 years of service committed to enhancing the spiritual, health care, education and social well-being of all persons. In 1858, a small congregation of Sisters led by Mother Xavier Ross (top photo), left Nashville, Tennessee, and ventured to the edge of an expanding frontier, settling in Kansas Indian Territory. Over the years, these women established schools, orphanages and hospitals throughout the western territories as the populations and needs of new communities grew.

The Sisters currently sponsor a variety of ministries in health care, education, social welfare, spiritual development and foreign missions. The historical roots of their health care ministry can be traced back to 1864 when the Sisters opened the first private hospital in the state of Kansas, Saint John Hospital. Within the next century the Sisters established, developed and staffed hospitals

in Montana, Colorado, Nebraska, New Mexico, California, Kansas and Wyoming.

In 1972, following a review of their first century in providing health care services, the Sisters recognized the need to unify and develop a more cohesive system for the hospitals, strengthening them individually and collectively. As a result of that review, the Sisters implemented the incorporation of the Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth Health System, a not-for-profit Catholic health care system incorporated in the State of Kansas and formally known as the Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth Health Services Corporation.



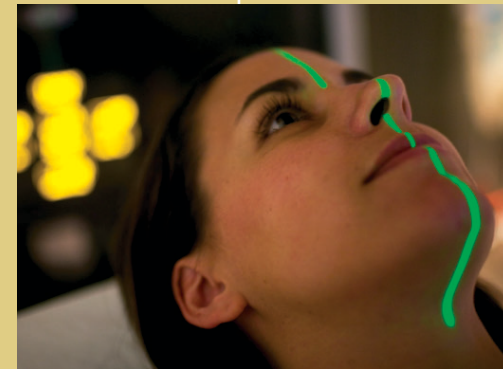
Since 1974, the System has undergone significant change. The need to work more closely as a System was identified as critical to succeed in an increasingly competitive health care environment. System-wide services and programs were enhanced to bring continuity, stability and greater value to the local hospitals. New opportunities were pursued to gain greater economies of scale, better allocate resources, and share best practices across the System. In May 2000 the Corporation changed its name to the Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth Health System (SCLHS) to more accurately reflect the way in which we are working together to strengthen our health care ministry.

Today, SCLHS is a vibrant system composed of nine hospitals and four stand-alone clinics for the uninsured that are making a difference in the health of the communities in which they serve. Although time has brought a decline in the numbers of Sisters actively working in the health ministry, it has also seen a growth in the number of lay leaders dedicated to continuing the mission of Catholic health care. It is this faith in the Mission and commitment to excellence that will sustain our ministry into the future.

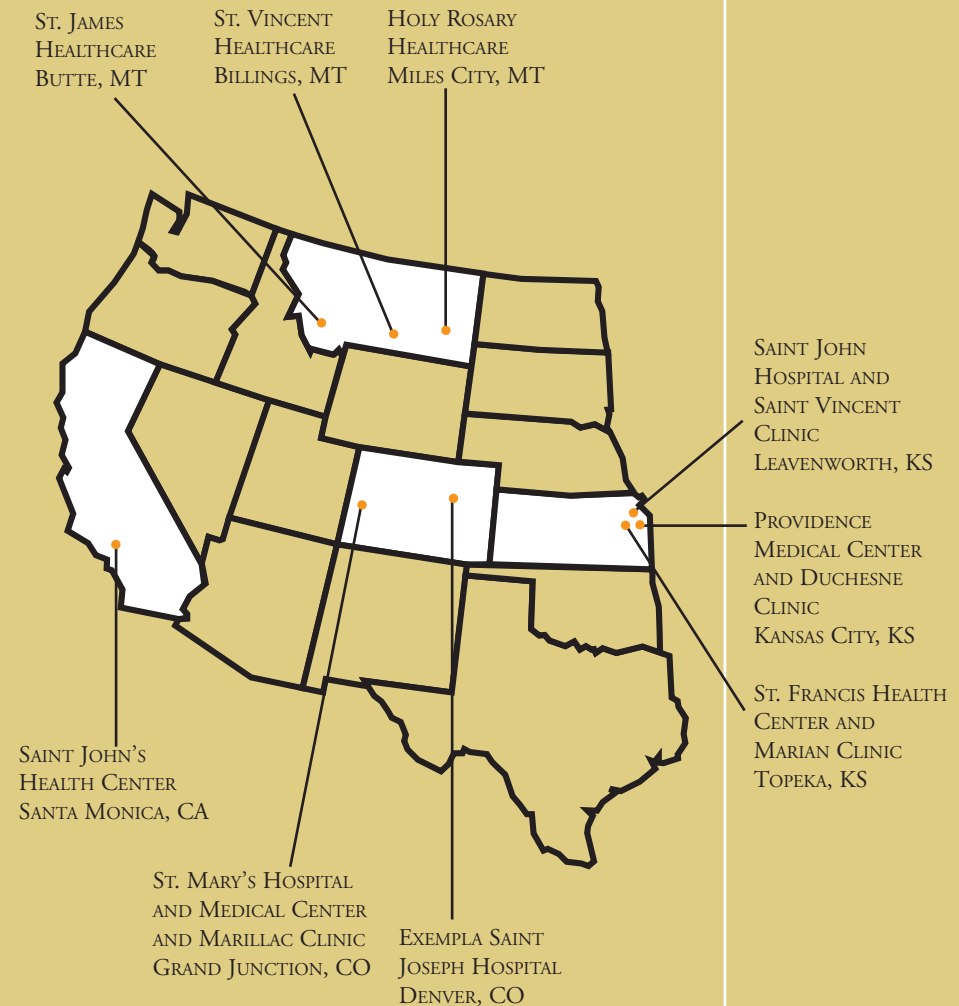

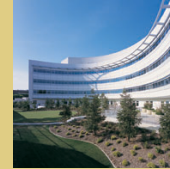

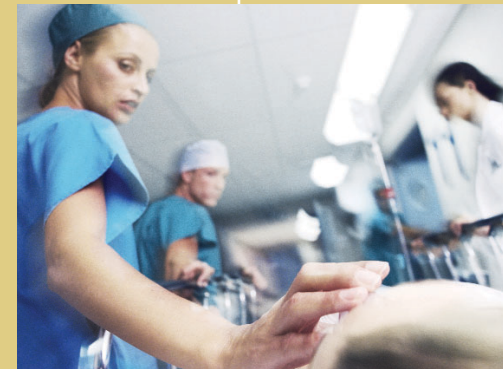

Duchesne Clinic strives to be known for our commitment and service to the uninsured poor by providing easy access to compassionate and trustworthy healthcare.

AREAS OF EXCELLENCE:

- **Diagnosis and treatment** of acute illnesses
- **Chronic Disease Management:** Patients receive ongoing management of chronic diseases, including diabetes, hypertension and depression.
- **Referrals:** Provides referrals for dental, optical and specialized medical care.

Marian Clinic offers health care, hope and healing for those who cannot afford medical and dental care on their own. The Clinic is an outreach of St. Francis Health Center, Topeka, Kan., the main provider of donated hospitalization and services for surgery, emergency care, lab and x-ray. Stormont-Vail HealthCare has also donated in-kind services since 2005.

AREAS OF EXCELLENCE:

- **Medical Care:** Delivered on-site with referrals as needed for specialists' consultations and treatment, health education and medications.
- **Dental Care:** From the East Sixth Avenue location, the Dental Clinic provides dental services that include exams, cleanings, x-rays, restorations, extractions, fillings, sealants and preventive education.
- **Women's Health:** Program provides health screenings and physical, educational and supportive services for the unique needs of women.

Marian Clinic welcomes residents who are living at or below 175 percent of federal poverty guidelines and have no insurance or other means to obtain care. More than 250 volunteer physicians, dentists, nurses and other health care professionals enable the staff to provide health care to Shawnee County residents and dental care to northeast Kansas residents. The clinic strives to be a place of welcome, of comfort, of healing and of hope.

Marillac's mission is to provide primary and preventive healthcare services for Mesa County's low-income, uninsured population in a manner that respects the individual's dignity.

The Marillac Clinic, located on the St. Mary's Hospital campus, has received national acclaim for its model of delivering integrated care to patients. This model fully integrates the medical and mental health needs of patients in the context of a primary care setting. Patients seen for medical appointments have access to spontaneous mental health services including individual counseling, family therapy, group therapy, case management and psychiatric assessment. Simultaneously, patients scheduled for mental health needs have access to an array of medical services within this single-visit model.

AREAS OF EXCELLENCE:

- **Disease Prevention and Education:** Patients receive thorough, cost-effective diagnosis, treatment and follow-up care for a wide range of conditions.
- **On-site Medication Outlet:** Patients have access to affordable prescription medication and on-going medication for both chronic and acute conditions.
- **On-site Dental Clinic:** Eligible adults and children receive preventive, restorative and pain relief services in 13 state-of-the-art dental operatories. A variety of services are available including cleanings, exams, x-rays, fillings, extractions and dentures as well as acute care for emergency conditions.
- **Optical Program:** A part-time optical program provides no-cost eye exams and affordable new eyeglasses for both children and adults.

Saint Vincent Clinic strives to be known for our commitment and service to the uninsured poor by providing easy access to compassionate and trustworthy healthcare.

Saint Vincent Clinic provides a wide range of services in a newly renovated facility.

AREAS OF EXCELLENCE:

- **Acute Illnesses:** Patients are cared for with the diagnosis and treatment of acute illnesses.
- **Referrals:** Referrals for dental, optical and specialized medical care are provided.
- **Chronic Disease:** Patients receive ongoing management of chronic diseases.
- **Pharmacy Assistance program:** Provides access to prescription medication.

Saint Vincent is the only clinic in Leavenworth County that provides primary health care to the uninsured. The Clinic provides primary health care to uninsured people living at or below 150 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines and serves approximately 20 people per day. Since it opened in 1986, Saint Vincent Clinic has provided over 71,000 patient visits to those in need, regardless of their ability to pay.
